#### Book of the Week

The children have been celebrating 'World Space Week'. They have enjoyed reading 'Whatever Next!' by Jill Murphy and 'The Way Back Home' by Oliver Jeffers. The children have been taking part in lots of different space-based activities and learning about different planets.

The children will be talking about Harvest and we will be reading the story of 'The Enormous Turnip'.

#### **Letters and Sounds Activities**

Listening Walk – Take your child on a listening walk either indoors or outdoors. Encourage them to listen attentively to the sounds around them. Talk about the different sounds they can hear. After you have finished your listening walk, see if you can make a list or draw pictures of all the sounds you can remember.

**Drum outdoors** - Give your child a beater or make drumsticks, for example a wooden spoon, a stick, a ladle. Encourage your child to explore the outdoor area and discover how different sounds are made by tapping or stroking, with their beaters. Ask your child to demonstrate their favourite sound. ## Maths Activities Nursery (2-3 years)
