


# What was the legacy of the Romans invasion of Britain?



## Key Vocabulary

<b>Celts</b>	Celts lived in Britain from roughly 600BC to 43AD.
<b>Britons</b>	People inhabiting Britain prior to the Anglo-Saxon invasions.
<b>Ancient Rome</b>	A powerful and important civilization that ruled much of Europe for nearly 1000 years.
<b>Invasion</b>	To enter as an enemy, by force, in order to conquer or plunder.
<b>Borders</b>	The line between two countries, counties, or towns.
<b>Centurion</b>	A position in the Roman army (the commander of a century).
<b>Emperor</b>	An emperor is a male who rules an empire.
<b>Empire</b>	A group of countries ruled by a single person, government or country.
<b>Legacy</b>	Something inherited from past generations and passed to future generations.
